Dear Mrs Ceylan:

In a letter dated 19 June 2018, you made a complaint in respect of the Honourable J. Paul R. Howard of the Superior Court of Justice of Ontario. In a letter dated 29 August 2018, we advised you that your complaint was dismissed as it did not raise any issue of conduct on the part of the judge. In the numerous emails that followed, the first one dated 19 September 2018, you asked for further investigation. You allege a conspiracy between the various lawyers, the mediator and the judge. I note that a complaint you made to the Law Society was dismissed. I also note that you were not a party to the proceedings.

We explained in our previous letter that you were mistaking the nature of the order the judge signed, which was simply an endorsement of a draft order, on consent, of the deadlines for the parties. I also pointed out your erroneous assumptions about the role and procedures related to an examination for discovery. You disagreed and alleged corruption and a vast conspiracy.

The mandate of Council in matters of judicial conduct was explained in my previous letter. Council's mandate concerns federally-appointed judges. It does not concern lawyers, mediators and others involved in a law suit. It is not an appeal and Council does not review the facts of the case. Your many allegations concerning lawyers and the mediator fall outside Council's mandate and have not been reviewed.

In the light of the numerous emails you have been sending, and of the several allegations of corruption and conspiracy which are strictly based on speculation, I am of the view that your complaint is an abuse of the complaint's process and is vexatious. Your complaint is therefore dismissed.
